Lower School

In the last few weeks we have been finding out about people who help us, the services they work for and the equipment that they use.

Last week we visited the fire station and then on Thursday we had a fire engine and fire-fighters on the playground and the children got to use the hose and sit in the fire engine. It was very exciting.



This week classes will be visiting local hair dressers to find out about the job they do before returning to school to create their own styles using wool.

In Art this week we are doing Mothers' Day crafting but this must remain a secret until Sunday.

In Science we have been using ICT equipment to


record results. This has included cameras, iPads and electronic bathroom scales. The children have also been on Spring walks to look for new plants that are growing and the children have used their knowledge to understand what plants need to grow.

In History we have been sorting old and new by comparing toys, the fire service and transport using pictures and real objects.

Middle School

The children in Middle School have continued their topic about plants and growing. They have been learning to identify and name the parts of a plant. The bean stalks which they have been growing are getting taller by the minute.

The children have also been drawing their own beanstalks and measuring them using multi-link. They have also been learning to use words such as taller and shorter and have been working out if they are taller or shorter than a tree or a flower.



All of the children have been reading the story of Oliver's Vegetables by Alison Bartlett and Vivian French and following the Puffin's trip to the allotment both Swifts and Toucans have visited the vegetable garden at Myddelton House in Enfield. It is a really lovely

garden and if you want to visit it is free.

In cooking this week the children have made sandwiches using the cress which they have grown as one of the fillings.

Upper School

The Upper School have continued their topic about explorers by looking at the first space explorations.

They have learnt about Sputnik and its journeys in low Earth orbit and about Sputnik 2 which carried Laika the dog. Laika was a stray from the streets of Moscow who became one of the first animals in space



They have also found out about Yuri Gagarin who was the first human in space.

The children also role played the Moon landings.

In Maths the children have been practising telling the time and working out simple time problems. In Technology the children have been making Easter baskets and in Art they have been making Mother's Day cards in the style of Kandinsky. You will have to wait until Sunday to see how they turned out.

Eagles are working towards their endeavour awards at horse riding. After half-term Kingfishers will be horse riding and Eagles and Kestrels will be swimming.
