



## PE and Sports Premium Funding

Academic Year 16/17

The government has announced that it is providing another year of additional funding to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, will be allocated to primary school headteachers. The money must be used to improve the provision of PE and school sport.

At Middleton School:

- ✚ All pupils have access to a broad, balanced and interactive curriculum, appropriately differentiated according to their individual needs. The curriculum and schemes of work are structured to ensure that all pupils can fully engage in the learning activities and consequently no child is excluded as a result of their special educational needs, gender or race.
- ✚ A wide range of sporting, PE and enrichment activities are used to make learning relevant to the child, irrespective of his / her socio-economic, ethnicity or faith background. Cross curricular teaching is extensively used in order to support this.
- ✚ Sport, swimming and PE are essential components of the school's curriculum planning both in terms of a discrete subject and as support for cross curricular learning. This is reinforced and extended through leisure and dance activities as well as through activities with special and mainstream schools. Pupils join in with special and mainstream peers in order to participate in Hertfordshire Dance Festivals. Upper School pupils also participate in regular horse riding sessions with Riding for the Disabled.
- ✚ Teachers use on-going and summative assessment to ensure that all children progress well towards their targets and appropriate action is taken to remediate for any difficulties that a child may face in relation to this. As a result, teaching is well placed to support the development of each child's physical and sporting skills.
- ✚ Pupils enhance their learning in PE through a wide range of activities and leisure pursuits. These include traditional team games and individual sports as well as all manner of activities which are designed to build stamina and encourage physical activity. By having this broad view Middleton School is able to meet the needs of all pupils and develop pupil interest and excitement in physical activity of any sort which will build stamina and improve fitness.
- ✚ Formal sport / PE teaching activities are supported and extended through lunchtime clubs and after school clubs throughout the year. Additionally pupils are encouraged to join sporting clubs in their local community and we regularly promote and advertise opportunities to support this in our news letter. We also host a weekly special needs dance club which some of our children attend.

Sports premium is allocated twice per year. The total for this academic year is £8400.
