Lower School

We have been busy in Lower School working on our topic of 'hot and cold'. The children have learnt about the Great Fire of London - the Robins dressed up as firefighters and extinguished our tissue paper fire! All of the classes have created fire collages and selected colours to represent the 'heat'.

In science we have been exploring the effects of heat upon food. The children looked at how eggs, chocolate and bread alters when heat is applied. The children made predictions about what may happen, and then described the outcomes. They also discussed which equipment we could find in the kitchen to heat food.



During offsite visits this week, the pupils have visited a travel agent to look for brochures of hot and cold holiday destinations.

Middle School

Middle School pupils have begun work on their new topic 'The Victorians'. They have explored old and new toys and looked at the differences between them. In RE they have learnt the story of Rama and Sita and found out all about the celebrations that coincide with Divali.



In maths they have been using the balance scales to decide if an item is heavy or light.
