Lower School

Pupils in Lower School are continuing with their 'hot' and 'cold' topic. To explore this theme they visited the ice rink at van hages this week! (Just watching!)

As part of their RE and English lessons some of the children have even produced their own Christmas story film watch out Spielberg! In Middle School this week the pupils have been learning about Advent and also exploring the Nativity story. They have enjoyed decorating the department as we prepare for Christmas. 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Upper School

Within maths, the pupils are learning about 'capacity' and have been using the terms 'full' and 'empty' as well as beginning to measure using millilitres.
Within English the children have been learning to describe using adjectives and in art they have represented the style of a range of different artists in their work.
