We are still conducting EHCP reviews with families and if you have not yet had your review then you will hear from us over the next week so that we can schedule a convenient date.

You should continue to receive welfare telephone calls from your child's class teacher. If you have any concerns or questions please do share them during this call.

If you have changed your personal details in the last 12 weeks (eg phone number or email address) please let the school office know so that we can ensure we remain in regular contact with you.

We continue to watch closely the national picture and refer to government guidance. As I explained in the last letter, the guidance for special schools differs greatly to that for mainstream schools. As you can imagine, the issues and concerns in a school such as ours differ to those in the mainstream setting. The DFE are aware that for pupils with additional needs, the process will need to be tailored and there must be a high regard for health and safety and pupil well being. We will need to consider transition arrangements for all of our pupils across the school and this is a subject which we will address in future communication.

For the time being I will leave you with our 'welcome back to school' banner and thank you all once again for your overwhelming support and understanding.
