We are aware that there are a number of pupils who are currently self isolating and unable to attend school. On Tuesday 1st December we will launch a new page on our website which is dedicated entirely to home learning. On the home page of our website vou will now find a tab at the top entitled 'Remote Learning'. When you click on this tab you will view a sub menu and will have three options to choose from: Lower School, Middle School or Upper School. Within these selections you will then be asked to open either, lower ability, middle ability or higher ability and you can be guided towards which level is most appropriate by your class teacher. You will then be faced with a display of curriculum areas which contain resources to support home learning for your child. Quite a few of our current resources are linked to a popular children's books. You will find videos, hard copy resources and ideas to

support you in assisting your child to learn from home. In addition we will be offering daily virtual lessons via zoom. These will also be displayed on the website, although you will need to obtain an access code from the school office.

If your child is isolating at home then we will send you a full programme for the week so that you can plan your time effectively with your child.

Our thoughts are with all families who are currently isolating at home or supporting family members who are suffering from Coronavirus. Please do remember that we are at the end of a phone line if you need somebody to talk to. We look forward to seeing your children back in school soon.
