Pupil Progress end of KS1 – end of KS2 – 2019/2020 cohort

We will begin by looking at pupil progress between KS1 and KS2. Our aim, as in previous years, is for pupils to make two full levels of progress between the end of year two and the end of year six. Pupils who make two or more full levels of progress are considered to have made good progress while pupils who make three or more full levels of progress are considered to have made outstanding progress.

The July 2020 cohort is made up of 17 year six pupils. However, we only have data for pupil attainment at the end of KS1 for fifteen of these pupils. Therefore the following tables refer to a cohort of fifteen year six pupils for whom we have a full set of data.

The table above demonstrates that 89% of pupils (the vast majority) of pupils made outstanding progress within English and 80% (4/5) of the cohort made outstanding progress within maths.

If we analyse this data according to specific strands within the curriculum subjects it is evident that Speaking was an area of particular recognition with 93% of pupils achieving two full levels of progress.

Outstanding progress made by some pupils, who achieved at least three full levels of progress between end of KS1 and end of KS2 is highlighted in the area of reading. 67% of pupils achieved at least three full levels of progress within reading.

This is in line with data collected for the 2018 and 2019 cohorts as demonstrated in the table below for pupils achieving two full levels of progress. However a greater percentage of pupils made three of more levels of progress than the previous year.

It is pleasing to see that there are some pupils, within this cohort, who have made four or more full levels of progress between the end of KS1 and the end of KS2
