Poorly children!

Unfortunately we have experienced quite a bit of ill health among our pupil population this week. Thank you to parents who have erred on the side of caution and kept their child at home until they are fully well again, as this does help to reduce the spread of nasty germs! I will just take this opportunity to re-iterate

our current policy on ill health under COVID guidance and rules.

If a pupil presents with one of the three recognised COVID symptoms: high temperature, new and persistent cough, loss of taste or smell then we will ask you to collect your child and take them home. We strongly encourage families to seek a PCR test for their child wherever possible. If a PCR test is returned as negative, then your child may return to school once they are well again. (Result to be shared with school). If you are unable to obtain a PCR test or the test is positive then vour child will need to remain at home to isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms.

In addition to the above, we are also beginning to see a sharp increase in sniffles and colds and Autumnal bugs! If your child is unwell when in school, we may ask you to collect them and for your child to remain at home until the symptoms have dispersed.

Fingers crossed for a healthier outlook over the next few weeks!

Please note that I cannot authorise any holidays that occur during term time. (Other than in exceptional circumstances) However, may I please take this opportunity to remind you that we have extended the half term holiday by an extra week

in May/June to allow families to potentially book some holiday when other schools will have returned to school.
