### Remote Learning

We continue to offer parents the opportunity to access learning for their child from home in a variety of ways. Resources are placed on the school website, which we are happy to signpost parents to. Class teachers are able to forward packs of resources relevant to the learning needs of your child. In addition there will be daily access to a virtual lesson if your child is needing to isolate at home. These virtual lessons are a great way for pupils to remain in touch with their peers and teachers and also allow pupils to access learning directly from their staff team. We encourage all families to take up the opportunity to attend virtual lessons where this is appropriate and possible.

### Parent Pick Up and Drop Off

Several parents opt to bring their child to school themselves and it is lovely to have the opportunity to

wave and say Hello in the mornings. On occasions a family may need to transport their child on an adhoc basis. For this reason I will take this opportunity to remind families of the timings for parent pick up and drop off. In the morning the parent drop off time is 9.00am and in the afternoon, the parent pick up time is 3.10pm. If you arrive a little earlier than this time, then you will be directed to the layby at the front of the school and then guided as to when it is time to enter the playground. Cars park along the edge of the playground - reversing into a space. All engines are turned off once parked and no moving vehicles will be permitted to enter the playground once pupils are moving to the cars. When indicated, engines are turned back on and cars leave the playground in progressive order from the far end first. Staff will quide and direct this process. Safety of the pupils is ALWAYS our priority and we thank our regular visiting parents who respect these rules and work with us to protect the safety of all.
