## Year Six Reading Attainment – July 2022 cohort

At Middleton School, we aim to raise attainment within reading so that as many pupils as possible transition from KS2 to KS3 as M9 readers or above.

In July 2022, thirteen out of the fifteen pupils (87%) in year six had acquired an attainment of M9 or above. Of the 2 pupils who did not reach this attainment, both of them attained a level of M8, therefore on the cusp of attaining an M9 grade, and may well have achieved this target if they had not been impacted in their learning by the pandemic.

Comparisons with data from previous cohorts (bearing in mind that the 2020 and 2021 cohorts both missed a great deal of school owing to COVID19) are favourable.

The results demonstrate that steady progress has been made over the past five years to increase reading attainment for Year six pupils. In fact the attainment for 2022 was the best result for the percentage of pupils achieving M9 and above for five years which is most pleasing considering the schooling that has been missed. The 2021 cohort also had 20% of pupils who had attained a level M13, M14 or M15 grading and this has not been evidenced prior to 2021.
