In art lessons they have made some fantastic self portraits!

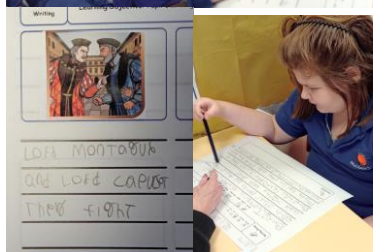


All Middle School classes visited Liverpool Street Station this week and had an amazing time. Staff were very impressed with their excellent safe behaviour.
